Living Lutheran

We experienced unpleasant air from forest fires this fall. Paradise (California) Lutheran Church experienced more than bad air in 2018. Now the church is building a fire-resistant structure in place of the parsonage that burned. It will have four apartments to rent to people who need housing in the community. From tragedy came a new way to serve.

In El Salvador the Lutheran church has become a partner with the Hungry Church, a church that serves gang members who have been deported from the United States. Hungry Church provides safe places to stay, income, job skills training, and other support. Lutheran Disaster Response provided a grant to assist training in carpentry and auto mechanics.

Cultural differences may make it seem like Lutherans in other parts of the world are different from us, but our ELCA bishop reminds us that we are one body—we are one in Christ.


Thank you, Community Supper
