

Watch Out ~ Computer/ **Security Fix Scam**

All too often, we continue seeing people getting duped into allowing a fraudster to take control of their computer, iPad, or smartphone. What happens is someone who is out to steal your money calls to tell you they are from Apple or Microsoft and they need to remote in to fix a security flaw. Another way they get in is when you get a pop-up on your screen telling you there is a security problem and to "click here" or call a number for Microsoft or Apple technical support. Never click or call any number in a pop-up.

Nobody from Apple or Microsoft will ever call you! In fact, we'd bet you would never get anyone on the phone if you did try to call them. Do not ever allow anyone who says they are from Apple or Microsoft to remote into your device. They're attempting to steal your account info. Remember: If you have money, it's very likely someone has you in their sights.
