the Reformation, I'm including here a number of "Sayings in Which Luther Found Comfort." They come from Luther's Works, Vol. 43: Devotional Writing II, pages 171-177. Let us all find comfort in the Gospel as Pastor Luther did.

There are times when, for the sake of God's

word, we must endure the hardship, anguish, and persecution which the holy cross brings upon us. In such times we can rightfully bestir and strengthen ourselves with God's help in such a way that we can be bold, alert, and



cheerful, committing our cause to God's gracious and fatherly will. Thus St. Paul says, II Timothy 3:12, "All who desire to live a godly life in Jesus Christ will be persecuted." And in Acts 14:22, "Through many tribulations we must enter into the kingdom of God," and

Philippians 2:12, "Work out your salvation with fear and trembling."





#### Make decorative stones as reminders of God's many great attributes.

#### What you need:

- Flat, smooth stones
- Printed, decorative napkins
- Paintbrush
- Clear-drying craft glue
- Scissors
- Permanent marker

#### What you do:

- 1. Unfold the napkin, carefully separating the printed side from the solid side.
- Brush a thin layer of glue atop

   a stone. Lay the napkin (printed
   side up) on the glue and press down.
   Paint more glue over the napkin.
   Let dry.
- 3. Turn the stone over and paint more glue on the back. Wrap the napkin edges around the stone, trimming as needed. Paint more glue over the napkin. Let dry.
- 4. On the stone, write an attribute of God (loving, wise, powerful, merciful, etc.).
- 5. Repeat with more stones. Use them as gifts, paperweights, table decorations, etc.

May you be comforted as Luther was, from these Words of Scripture, as you live out the Gospel!



This November, we have an opportunity to make a difference! They have also sent water purification kits to Ukraine.

When tornadoes and floods affected congregations in Wisconsin and Iowa, members and friends gathered to help, including providing lodging and day care for residents of the areas. 
## WATCH OUT ~ Key Takeaways

To help yourself stay safe, remember these guidelines:

- Enroll in additional security features like 2-factor authentication and secure your mobile phone and email accounts.
- Be wary of calls or emails threatening legal action or account closures. Don't trust calls from individuals claiming to represent technical support, the IRS, or your financial institutions.
- Take care with information shared on social media, don't send money to people you don't know, and investigate companies before doing business based on a social media ad or post.
- File your tax return as early as possible.
- Try to keep personal information private on social media and use privacy settings to limit who can see your posts.
- If something seems fishy, hit the brakes.

- Wait until your emotions have settled and research what's going on. Fraudsters use tight deadlines to try to force you into a rash decision.
- Never give away your passcode or password to anyone else.
- Never call back a number in a message asking for sensitive information. Don't follow a link in an unsolicited email or text message either. Go to the website of the company or organization, or call their main phone number, and get in touch with them through direct channels.
- When in doubt, do an internet search for the company or organization involved, followed by the word "scam."
- Remember that requests for payment in cryptocurrency, gift cards, or bank wires are red flags for scams.
- If you think you've been a victim of ID theft, report it to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) and potentially affected account institutions. Put a

freeze on your credit files if you don't plan to borrow money soon—or place a fraud alert on your credit reports. The freeze prevents any new credit from being approved, but you can freeze and unfreeze your credit file for free; e.g., temporarily while applying for new credit. The fraud alert notifies lenders and creditors that they should take extra steps to verify your identity before extending credit.

• Contact one of the three credit bureaus to request a fraud alert or credit freeze: Equifax at 800-525-6285, Experian at 888-397-3742, or TransUnion at 800-680-7289. – Melissa Probst
